Sara* had a plan for her life: she was fast-tracking to get a scholarship, and there was no way she could be pregnant. After her ultrasound she made an appointment for an abortion. Our staff and wonderful prayer network prayed for her. I dragged my feet following up because I knew it was going to be a hard conversation, but when I called, she told me her plans had changed. The scholarship had fallen through and she was keeping her baby!

It's amazing to me that someone like Sara can be so hardened and believe the lies of the enemy, and yet that's Jesus sitting there in the discussion room (Matthew 25). We reach out and love her just like we would Jesus and trust Him with the outcome.

I prayed for our conversation before I called her for a post-partum follow-up. When she answered, she sounded so happy. She had delivered a healthy baby boy.

She told me things had been going well for her and her child, she had gotten a good job, and now she was back in the same situation she was in a few years ago. Our conversation went deep but it wasn't a typical appointment because she was not considering abortion. She told me she was a Christian, so I asked her, "How is your relationship with Jesus?" She couldn't answer. Even though she was a believer, she didn't yet have a personal relationship with Jesus. It was so good to sit beside her and just share Jesus with her and tell her how much He loves her.

The staff at Options recently set two days aside for a local retreat. Plans for this time away included doing some team building and work on a vision for the year ahead. There were some great revelations as we stretched ourselves through various activities, sometimes outside of our comfort zones. When all was said and done, everyone agreed this time together was well spent.

The second day together was focused on vision for the year ahead. Sometimes the work in the lives of patients at Options gets messy and discouraging. We don't always hear the good

outcomes! Sharing the uplifting stories had to be part of the agenda! I asked each of the staff to share one of the most inspiring stories in working with a patient from the past year. Those stories are reported to you in this newsletter.

What inspired me big-time in the past few months was when I saw a direct correlation between a prayer time with the Options staff prior to beginning our day and how the day actually unfolded. The day prior to this incident was one where many of us were deeply discouraged. In our collective prayers, we asked God to encourage us and to bring us women who needed the services we offer. It's a prayer we often offer at the start of a service day, but for some reason this day felt "different."

The inspiring part for me came at the end of the day when our mobile team returned to the office with a report of a patient who had been on board that day. A woman came with her husband from some distance. While at the Options mobile clinic, our team was able to minister to both the patient and her husband. The time they

spent with our staff was informational, loving and non-judgmental. In addition to several community resources, the couple left with a Bible with underlined verses that were shared during their time with the Options staff. There were tears of sadness and of joy shed that day on board the mobile and again at the clinic in Albany.

Do you know that Options in Albany is serving patients 4 days a week? And the mobile clinic is out serving patients twice a week?

While it's easy to keep tabs on a brick & mortar clinic, the mobile has had a few location changes in the past several months. This is part of the strategy identifying the best parking spot to offer services. Effective community engagement has helped secure parking locations at Grocery Outlet on 9th Street in Corvallis on Wednesdays and at Philomath Community Services on Thursdays. As we look towards the future to add service locations, our partnership with ICU Mobile will help strategically. We continue to work with our community partners to determine the best locations to add services.

We told you about the grant from Focus on the Family that provided a state-of-the-art portable ultrasound machine on the mobile clinic. We were also privileged to work with the Knights of Columbus from Gervais to acquire a grant for an ultrasound machine in our Albany Clinic! The new ultrasound machine has very sharp images that show life in the womb from as early as 6 weeks into a pregnancy. What a wonderful tool. We are so grateful for our partnership with the Knights of Columbus.
