### **Ultrasound Saves Lives!**

### **Real-Life Stories** What inspires you? Here are some of the stories that inspire the staff at Options!



In the three months I have been on staff at Options, I have encountered many inspiring stories. I recently followed up with Cora,\* a patient who came to Options in the spring. Cora is an independent young woman in a hard situation, sleeping on friends' couches and due to deliver around Christmastime. When I asked her what is on her baby supply list, she said she has nothing. It is very hard for her to ask for help, so I asked if I could make the calls to community resources for her. "That would be awesome!" she said. I have been able to connect her directly with different housing opportunities and organizations that can help her prepare for her baby and get on her feet. Here is a mom in need who doesn't want to say, "I need," and I am so happy we can be the connecting piece for her.

For me, the most inspiring stories are about prayer. God is so powerful, and He is always at work here at Options. I had been praying specifically for our new Clinic Operations Manager, Jemima, to have one of those appointments where a patient comes in planning on abortion and then changes her mind. Jemima stopped me in the parking lot one day without even knowing I had been praying for her, and said, "I had one of those appointments!" A patient had told her, "I just can't have this baby," but in their follow-up phone call, she told Jemima she was keeping the baby after all. God answered prayer that day, and I am so grateful for His powerful intervention and the encouragement He gives us.

The language barrier made it difficult to connect with Julia,\* and we lost touch until she told us she had gone through with an abortion. "We are always here for you," I texted her, and she texted back within seconds, asking for a counseling appointment. When she arrived, her eyes were brimming with tears. For the next two hours, one of our volunteers and I cried with her, prayed with her, hugged her (pre-COVID), and shared the Gospel with her. I have never before seen someone so broken experience so much healing. She walked out of the clinic with a Bible in her language, tears of joy washing away her tears of grief. Even though she chose abortion, she reminded me that Options exists to share the message of eternal life.

Every day at Options I get to witness stories that inspire and encourage me. One of my favorites is Katie's\* story. She has a history of miscarriage and was thrilled to be pregnant but pretty anxious about losing the baby. Her ultrasound went great and as time passed she came back for a couple of model ultrasound appointments. She was so happy to finally have a healthy pregnancy when she didn't think she'd ever have a child of her own. She really appreciated Options' services, most of all the care and kindness she received. "You didn't treat me as fragile," she said. "You encouraged me and gave me hope."

Lily\* felt she had to have an abortion. Her boyfriend already had a family, and she was not happy about the situation. When we talked, she said she had counseled her sister not to have an abortion, but here she was in the same situation and she didn't see any other option for herself. When she came back for her ultrasound, though, she told me with a smile on her face, "I think I want to keep this baby." She was worried about losing her job, so I encouraged her to talk to her boss and request reasonable accommodation during her pregnancy. I was so proud to see her muster the courage to talk to her boss and most of all to choose life. Now she is the proud mama of a healthy baby girl.

Tess\* had told us abortion went against everything she was and believed, but her partner was putting a lot of pressure on her to have an abortion. "I don't want this and I'm going back to my ex," he told her. She was feeling very alone and was afraid to tell her mom that she was pregnant again. We talked with her a lot about adoption. Several months later, after getting no response to most of my follow-up calls, I connected with her and learned that she is eagerly awaiting the birth of her baby boy and planning to parent. She was so appreciative of Options' services, and I was overjoyed that the love and support and resources we offered could help her choose life for her little one.
